M. Forster Prize in America. In 2012 she was awarded the PEN Pinter Prize. She was Poet Laureate from 2009 to 2019.

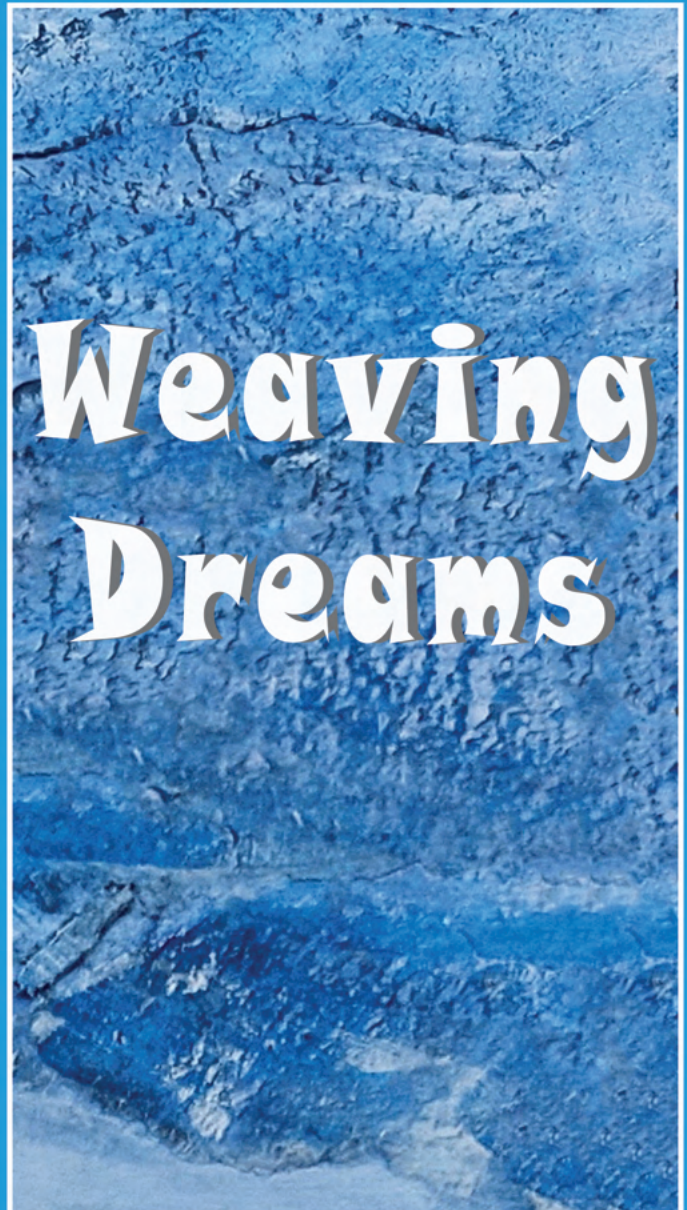

Saint Mary's Festival 2024

It is a great pleasure to be able to invite you to join us for the second Saint Mary's Festival, a celebration of musical and visual arts in the heart of the town. This year the festival is themed around the well-known story of Joseph, his brothers, his coat, and his dream interpretations.

We are pleased to be working with a number of local partners to present a varied programme of entertainment and exhibitions. There are opportunities to share food and drink and to worship in this historic church building. At the centre of the Festival will be a coat of colour, created by our congregations and the wider local community. Around the coat there will be artwork produced by children from primary schools, as well as work by local photographers and artists.

Musical performances will be provided at lunchtimes and in the evenings over a 2-week period. Many of these are by musicians well-known in the local area. We are also pleased to welcome former Poet Laureate and Stafford resident, Carol Ann Duffy, back to Saint Mary's.

There are opportunities for you to get involved too: singers are welcome to join in our "Come and Sing Evensong" event, while youngsters can join our Children's Choir for an open choir rehearsal for our Sunday service. On Saturday 6th July children from local schools will gather for a workshop and performance of Joseph and The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat.

Our daytime events are provided free of charge, although we welcome donations to help defray costs. Evening events are ticketed and can be purchased on the door or at

Travelling to Saint Mary's

By train

Saint Mary's Church is a short walk across Victoria Park from Stafford railway station (West Coast Main Line).

By road

From the M6 motorway, exit at J13 and follow A449 Wolverhampton Road, or at J14 and follow A34 Stone Road, towards the Town Centre. Convenient public car parks can be found at Waterfront (ST16 2HQ), South Walls (ST16 3AQ) and North Walls (ST16 3AD). Road access to Saint Mary's is limited.

Walking

Saint Mary's Place is off Greengate Street, just south of Market Square. It can also be accessed via Mill Street or Tenterbanks if approaching from Victoria Park or Stafford railway station.
